1. Independent clause . (An **independent clause** is a complete sentence).

2. Independent clause ; Independent clause . (Clauses are closely related)

3. Independent clause ; therefore , Independent clause .
 however
 nevertheless
 consequently
 furthermore
 moreover

Clause: A group of words that has a subject and a verb.

Phrase: A group of words that does NOT have a subject and a verb.

4. Independent clause , for Independent clause .
and
nor
but

5. Independent , NE phrase or clause , clause .
 of course
 on the other hand
 laughing like a hyena
 his heart beating wildly

OR

Independent Clause , NE phrase or clause .
 which...

(non-essential phrases/clauses: not essential to the meaning of the sentence and can be removed).

6. **If** dependent clause , Independent clause .

7. Independent clause **if** Dependent clause .

after

8. Independent clause : A , B , and C . **or** Independent clause : Independent clause .

(Use when the second clause explains the first.)

9. "English is my favorite class," he said.
 He said, "English is my favorite class."
 "English," he said, "is my favorite class."
 "English is my favorite class," he said. "I love to read and write."
 He asked, "What is your favorite class?"
 Who said (that) English is their favorite class?
 Who said, "English is my favorite class?"

Clause: A group of words that has a subject and a verb.

Phrase: A group of words that does NOT have a subject and a verb.

10. Introductory phrase/transition , Independent clause .
 Swimming rapidly, First, For example,
 Living close to school, Suddenly, Furthermore,
 The next day, In the novel, After the dance,
